Year 4 and 5 Taster Day at Mill Chase Academy

We have invited your son/daughter to attend a taster day with us on Tuesday 19th June. The day will be an opportunity for pupils to experience a typical day at Mill Chase. They will have a short assembly when they arrive and then have four lessons, delivered by our subject specialists. The children may wear trainers for the day if they wish so that they have suitable footwear for playtimes. They will also need to bring a water bottle.

We have arranged to collect the pupils and their teachers from The Holme and transport them to Mill Chase. At the end of our day, please pick up your child from Mill Chase at 2.45pm. If you come to the main reception, a member of staff will meet you and take you to your child's class teacher, so that you can sign your child out. If you are unable to collect from Mill Chase, we will then transport the children and staff back to The Holme, arriving at approximately 15:05.

We will provide all children with lunch, served by our catering team, which will be a baked potato with a choice of toppings followed by an ice-lolly for dessert. The timetable for the day is:

9am – Assembly and tour of the school.

9:50-10:50 – Lesson 1

10:50-11:50 – Break – This will be held in the sports hall or on the astroturf pitch and will allow time for a snack and a chance to run around.

11:15-12:15 – Lesson 2

12:15-12:45 – Lunch Break – This will take place in our school dining hall.

12:45-1:45 – Lesson 3

1:45-2:45 – Lesson 4

This is an exciting time to be part of Mill Chase Academy. Examination results have risen for the last four years and as you know we were recently judged by Ofsted to be a Good school across all areas. We are fully staffed with expert subject specialists. 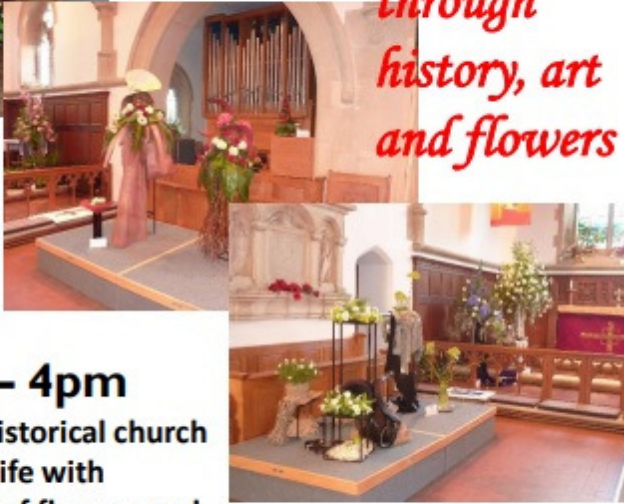
